GOSPEL MEDITATION:

"Good family relations represent irreplaceable wealth. We cannot be indifferent to the family's future, a community of life and love, an irreplaceable and indissoluble covenant between man and woman, a place of encounter between generations, the hope of society" (Pope Francis). We place ourselves under the protection of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph. No matter how much the powers of this world try to put an end to families, they will not be able to, because families are not alone. God in his providence always protects and cares for them. The Holy Family takes care of the spouses and their sons and daughters.

"It is necessary that in the family we pray for each one, according to the measure of the good that the family constitutes for him and the good that he constitutes for the family. Prayer confirms this good more solidly precisely as a common good of the family. Indeed, prayer is also the beginning of this good, in an ever-renewed way" (St. John Paul II). How many prayers do you do as a family? How much time do you spend caring for the family? The Church has always been concerned with the care of the family. Several ecclesial documents are dedicated to the family: Apostolic Exhortation Familiaris Consortio, Evangelium Vitae, Dignitas Connubii (Dignity of Marriage), to mention a few. Consecrating our sons and daughters to God is a great blessing for everyone. It is a way of practicing love for one another in the family nucleus.
